Communication and Language

This term, we are going to learn, two new poems 'I have a Little Frog and Pitter Patter'. We are also going to learn seven new rhymes Oranges and Lemons, One, Two Buckle my Shoe, Pat-a-cake, Polly put the Kettle on, Round and Round the Garden, Old McDonald, Horsie Horsie.

Understanding the World

We are going to continue to explore the natural world in our 'Forest Adventure' sessions with Mrs Rees.

We will also find out more about the four seasons and investigate why shadows appear and disappear.



Expressive Arts and Design

As part of our art this term will be using a range of materials to create symmetrical butterflies, a replica of Van Goghs famous sunflowers, a tree to demonstrate the four seasons and shadow puppets.

In our music lessons we are going to be exploring sound using our voices and musical instruments.
