We will also have some new pupils joining us in September in addition to our full intake in EYFS.

Dear Parents and carers.

The last few weeks of term have contained some truly magical moments. Thank you to all parents, staff and pupils who have taken part in such a positive manner. Thank you to parents who have supported the staff and the school in the many events which have taken place. The memorial bench for Mrs Marshall was also revealed this week. It is a lovely stone bench and the base of it was reclaimed stone from St Whites primary school in Cinderford. It is lovely to think that these lovely crafted pieces of stone have been placed back in to a local primary school site for another 100 years or so! A lovely piece of history. The area surrounding the bench is beautiful and is a reflection area for children to spend time, reflecting, pondering and remembering.

We have also had a joyous sports day, which saw the whole school come together, a memorable whole school trip to the Wild Place, which created some lovely memories for the children, a lovely fantastic sponsored walk in memory of Mrs Marshall, transition days, the summer fare and the year 6 leavers assembly. Enrichment week was also a great success and hopefully inspired the children, gave them new experiences and helped to raise their aspirations, as well as having some fun! It was just as we had hoped. Thank you to to staff for organising these fabulous events in addition to your normal teaching commitments.

Now the year has come to an end, we have many wonderful memories and the children have been a true delight. They have settled back in well to full time school, after the covid pandemic, which seems such a long time ago now. They have started to build their resilience back up. The teachers and staff have worked incredibly hard to close any gaps in learning the children may have had from the school closures and the vast majority are back on track with their learning. The children are also back in the swing of socialising with their peers, which is lovely.

Our Statutory assessment results this year have been incredible. As we are a small school, the percentages and results can vary depending on cohort size and the needs of the children but we are proud of each and every child and they all did extremely well. The data is provisional and has not been validated but the draft data is very pleasing. All we ask is that children do their best and reach their full potential.

The data for EYFS was 60% reaching a good level of development, with individual early leaning goal areas ranging from 75-100% at the expected level. This is brilliant. Thank you to Miss Peart, with the support of Miss Comley, for working so hard with Oak class this year and giving them a fantastic start to school and preparing them for year 1.

Year one phonics screening was also great with 81% pass rate. KS1 reading was 78% achieving the expected standard and 22% greater depth (exceeding the expected standard), writing was 78% expected standard and 6% greater depth and maths was 84% expected standard with 28% Greater depth. Thank you to Miss Chisman, with the support of Mrs Rees and Mrs Olley, for working hard with the year 2 children to ensure they made fantastic progress this year and are ready and prepared for KS2. These results are strong, although national data hasn't been released yet for these tests we are positive that these results will be at least in line with national and probably a lot higher.

KS2 data was also very strong and higher than the provisional national this year. Reading was 79% expected standard and greater depth 37%, writing was 79%, maths expected level was 84% and greater depth 32%. This is brilliant too! Thank you to Mrs Woodhouse with the support of Mrs Genner-Morris. This data is strong and reflects the hard work of all staff, the support of parents and the children putting in effort to do their best. The greater depth results in reading and maths are very good, this demonstrates that we challenge all pupils.

The multiplication check results for year 4 were good too. Thank you to Miss Briggs, Mrs Hunt and Mrs Sheppard. They worked so hard with the children to ensure they were able to recall their times tables and complete the statutory test. Well done all, it is a team effort. Thank you to all staff who have worked so hard, in all year groups, to prepare these children for these tests and to parents for supporting them. This will set them in good stead for their next phase in education.

We have high expectations for all at Ellwood Community Primary School, pupils, staff and parents, and we wouldn't have it any other way. We want the best outcomes for the children, whether academic or social and we want to ensure they are prepared for the future. Therefore, we expect the children to be the best they can be and don't settle for any thing less. This year the children have really risen to the challenge. Thank you for supporting your child, the staff and the school. We might not always appear to get it right and you may not always agree but the child/ren are always at the heart of any decisions we make. We are in it for the long term and make decisions which will help the children in the long run and their future life, not just for short term gain.

The recent pupil survey was also very pleasing and this has helped to confirm that what we strive to do has a positive impact on the children. They enjoy school, feel happy, enjoy the opportunities they are given, have good relationships with others and feel safe. What more can we ask!

Now the school has fallen quiet for the summer and we will start to organise and prepare for the academic year ahead.

Never a dull moment - no wind down but a wind up for the next academic year! Although, I really hope staff have some time to relax and unwind after such a busy year. It seems to get busier and busier in schools each year. Thank you to all staff, in whatever role you play in school, for your dedication, hard work and support. It takes a team and they are a pretty fantastic team! I would also like to thank our governors for their commitment and time. It is a role that sometimes goes unrecognised but the responsibility for the governing board is huge and it is voluntary role. They give up their own time in their busy schedules and work hard in the best interest of the pupils and do a very hard but fantastic job.

We wish our lovely year 6 children all the best as they move onto their next chapter. They have always been a lovely group of children and are good role models for the younger children. We hope these younger pupils follow in their footsteps. We look forward to meeting and welcoming our new EYFS class in September.

We also say goodbye to some wonderful staff members who are moving on in their careers. That is one sad thing about developing amazing quality staff and good leaders, as a school, you inevitably lose them. However, that means our job has been successful and they can continue to influence more children's lives in other schools and the wider community. We wish them all well with their new ventures.

Mrs Threadgall, who is retiring and we wish her all the best for the future and hope she has a fantastic time.

We have some new staff joining us in September. Mrs King, EYFS class teacher, Miss Foxwell EYFS teaching assistant, Miss Morcom, working with beech class on a Friday and also teaching P.E throughout the week, as she is also a P.E specialist, Miss Williams in year 4 and Sycamore class in the afternoons and Mrs Breakwell in Willow class two days a week. They have met the children already so they will be a familiar face. We welcome them to Ellwood school and we know they will enjoy working here.

We hope you all have a lovely summer and I too am looking forward to spending some quality time with my own children. We don't have many summers with our children before they are grown up and the time passes so quickly, so please enjoy this summer with your family.
