We are at the end of week 2 already and it feels as though Christmas is just around the corner. We have some lovely learning activities planned for the rest of this term for the children which I'm sure they will all enjoy.

We are proud to announce that we have 16 new laptops and a new laptop trolley. This now gives us a fully working, class set of computers to be used in classes to support other lessons/subjects and to help teach our computing curriculum. Weekly Attendance

Our aim is to have our weekly attendance above 97% in line with the Local Authority's expectation. This week our whole school attendance was 98.7% which is over our target of 97% so well done everyone!

We are reviewing the attendance again over the next few weeks and children with under 90% will be contacted to discuss their child's attendance.

Before half term we had a significant number of pupils who were classed as having a persistent absence. Some children had attendance as low as 75 -80%. Obviously this cannot continue and we are in touch with the local authority. It could be that these families require external support from the inclusion team and early help.

If your child is well enough to attend school, please send them to school and we can inform you if they become unwell throughout the day. Please don't send children in for 48 hours after sickness or diarrhea.

Thank you to all the parents who are ensuring their child/ren attend school and are on time.

Having good attendance helps children to build resilience, make academic and social progress and prepares them for secondary school and work in the future.

The School council have been chosen for this academic year and are listed below. We have had a couple of meetings and decided on some ideas that we want to carry out throughout the year.




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Children are invited to wear PJ's on this day and we will have limited merchandise on sale after school.
