Holidays in term times cannot and will not be authorised following the school's attendance policy, local authority and dfe guidance. Unfortunately this is non negotiable. This applies to holidays recently taken, recent requests and any planned holidays.

There are 175 days which are not in term time for holidays to be taken. Holidays in term time will result in a penalty notice for each child and to each parent. It can also be given to any adult who cares for the child, in the same household. Several penalty notices have been issued last term and this term.

Please don't be offended if you receive a penalty notice as this is the procedure and process by which we are governed.

The Curriculum at Ellwood Community Primary School

At Ellwood Community Primary School, we pride ourselves on the Curriculum we provide for our children. The Curriculum, is well planned sequentially across all the year groups. We cover the Statutory National Curriculum for Year 1 - 6 and the EYFS Curriculum for the Reception class. We thought it might be helpful to share the overview of the Curriculum to give parents more of insight into the subjects which are taught at Ellwood. The vast majority of subjects are taught each week, however on occasions, subjects such as Art and DT are alternated every half term. English and Maths are taught daily, Science is taught for at least 1 ½ hours a week, PE (physical activity - which includes gym, swimming, daily mile, Forest adventures) is taught at least 2 hours per week. Non-core subjects are taught for approximately an hour a week each. Obviously on occasions this is adapted, depending on other events, trips, time constraints and curriculum areas but we provide a full and enhanced curriculum to all our pupils. There is a Curriculum section on the school website which parents can have a look at if they wish to find out more information. Meet the teacher meetings, termly overviews, parents consultations, the website and Dojo are also good opportunities to find out what the children have been learning and their intended learning for the term ahead.
