Importance of School Attendance:

In the UK it is a legal requirement that all children attend school between the ages of 5-16. When children and young people do not attend school and are not able to access a suitable education in other ways, it leaves them vulnerable to falling behind their peers, academically, socially and emotionally.

The phrase 'persistent absence from school' was defined in 2015 as less than 90 per cent school attendance. Being 'persistently absent' was reported to have economic, social and psychological costs for children and young people and their communities. In addition, children and young people who are absent from school, to any extent, are more likely to leave school with few or no qualifications and are more likely to be out of work, suffer mental health difficulties and become homeless.

Please come and see us if you need support in relation to your child's attendance.

If your child has attendance lower than 90% you may be contacted to be offered support.
