Swimming

Please note that swimming for KS2 children is not optional and is part of the school curriculum and all children must attend lessons unless there is a medical reason why they are unable to attend.

Online Safety

Fortnite and Sims are the latest games being played by our children. They are not suitable for younger children and pose a risk to children's safety. Please monitor what your children are accessing, watching, playing or communicating with. YouTube videos can also be dangerous, as often one video links to another and offers a selection of choices that are not necessarily appropriate for young children. Please also monitor what communication your child is having with others, they may be targeted by others who are being unkind or they themselves may be the one's making hurtful comments. The advice is that children should only play games/access computers, phones/tablets when parents are around and should monitor and limit the usage of electrical devises. Children should also have days off and a rest from using devices. Nationally children are becoming addicted and this can have a huge impact on their mental health, relationships, academic ability and physical health. We want our children to be safe.
