Using the text, 'The See-Saw' we will be using the text 'The See Saw'. Over the term the children will create wanted posters, sequence the story and write diary entries. Crummar, Punctuation and Spelling We will continue to use capital letters for names of people, places and at the start of sentences. Place Value We will learn how to count in multiples of twos, fives and tens and use this to solve mental calculations. We will continue to apply our knowledge of addition and subtraction with 20 and develop our Place Value knowledge further to numbers within 50. The children will learn how to measure length, height, weight and volume using non-standard units.	Animals and Humans In this unit children will identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. We will also identify and name a variety f common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. We will describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals (fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals, including pets).
