#### Playtime and Lunchtime Equipment



Sam spent an inspirational hour with Year 5 and Year 6 children. The children were delighted to learn lots about her life and work – and as a special treat, she read an extract from a new novel that she is hoping to have published. We were the first people to hear it! Later, Sam led a whole-school Assembly where she was hugely impressed with our children's listening skills, attitudes and behaviour. Sam praised the quality of our children's writing and she was very excited to present our weekly writing awards to each class's winner. She enjoyed her time with us so much that she has asked for permission to return in a few weeks. What a compliment! We are very excited that we will get to see her again soon.

#### Growth Mindset

We are currently carrying out a research project with other forest schools and the University of Gloucestershire. We are looking at the impact of growth mindset on the children's resilience and approach to their school work.

Miss Abbott launched the work with an assembly that introduced the concepts of perseverance, determination, resilience and rising to the challenge. The children in KS2 have completed a questionnaire to assess their current ability to cope with struggles with work or with their friends. This will be repeated in the summer term after we have embedded growth mindset in our teaching practice to see whether it has had any impact on the children's resilience.

All of the activities will be carried out as part of the normal school day and will not impact adversely on your children. All questionnaires will be kept confidential unless we contact you to ask for permission to use them. Children will be encouraged to challenge themselves in lessons and will learn that mistakes are a good learning opportunity. If you have any questions or concerns about the project please don't hesitate to contact Miss Abbott.
